Festival interns interact with traditional artists and culture bearers and support the production of large-scale, public educational programming. Interns work in:

- Production and operations
- Curatorial research
- Artist and event support
- Participant, volunteer coordination
- Marketplace
- Social media and web production
- Graphic design
- Foodways programming
- Visitor surveys
- Accessibility services
- Audiovisual documentation
- Administration

Festival interns should be comfortable working outdoors in high heat and humidity and in a fast-paced environment among crowds. Coursework or experience related to Indigenous cultural expressions is desirable but not required. Experience working with the public is also a plus.
